Terms of Reference

1. Background

The Faculty of Management and Social Sciences at CINEC Campus, Malabe, has formed a committee to address national-level projects in alignment with the new educational concept introduced by CINEC Campus. This initiative is based on policy proposals submitted to the Secretary of the Ministry of Education, Sri Lanka. The committee is tasked with fostering academic innovation and contributing to socio-economic development through strategic partnerships and impactful projects.

2. Objectives

The primary objectives of the committee are:

 - Prepare policy briefs and reports for submission to the Ministry of Education and other relevant bodies.
 - Disseminate project outcomes through publications, conferences, and community outreach.

4. Composition of the Committee

The committee shall consist of:

- Members
 - Faculty representatives with expertise in management, social sciences, and related disciplines.
 - Representatives from the relevant government organizations/industries.
 - External experts and advisors as required.
- Secretary: Appointed by the Dean to manage communications and documentation.

5. Reporting and Accountability

The committee will report progress to:

- 1. The Management of CINEC Campus on a quarterly basis.
- 2. The Secretary of the Ministry of Education, Sri Lanka, biannually.

6. Duration

The committee shall function for an initial term of three years, subject to review and extension based on its performance and the evolving needs of national priorities.

7. Expected Outcomes

- 1. Successfully executed national projects with measurable impacts.
- 2. Strengthened relationships between academia, government, and industry.
- 3. Enhanced reputation of CINEC Campus as a leading institution contributing to national development.








2. Leadership towards National Contribution

- Impact: Increased student engagement and heightened awareness about the importance of logistics as a career.





























CINEC Logistics Day program initially organized by FMSS later advanced to a national day in Sri Lanka.













- Milestone: Successfully submitted to and approved by the Ministry of Higher Education, marking a significant advancement in logistics education in Sri Lanka.




Supply chain Management (ScM) is the second generation of Logistics. FMSS planned the capacity building in this new area timely and introduced a new Degree program to cater to the future demand.



9.1 Issuance of Commemorative Stamp and First-Day Cover

- Description: Collaborated with the Department of Posts and Telecommunication to issue a stamp and first-day cover celebrating National Logistics Day.
- Objective: To create a lasting symbol of recognition for the logistics sector in Sri Lanka.











The Faculty of management and Social Sciences strongly believe that the two subjects namely, Logistics and Transport should go hand in hand. The name of the University degree states as BSc. (Hons) Logistics and Transport. Therefore, a request was made to the Ministry of Transport to launch the textbook on the National Logistics day under the ministry agenda.

10. Education Policy Proposals Submission - 2020

10.1 Formalize the new Concept.

Faculty of Management and Social Sciences took necessary steps to formalize the new education concept namely, Education vertical, integration along with some other important policy proposals.


The education policy proposals submitted by FMSS is evidence based. For example, the main proposal namely, education vertical intergration (EV1) has been tested and proved prior to the submission. The complete process of Vertically intergrating "Logistics" education in Sri Lanka.

11. Contributing to the Sinhala language

Faculty of Management and Social Sciences initiated discussions with industry experts in logistics to find most suitable term for logistics.

Introducing a Proper Sinhala Term for Logistics - 2021

- Activity: Developed and received approval for a standard Sinhala term for "logistics" from the Department of Official Languages.
- Impact: Facilitated better understanding and localization of logistics education and discussions.



FMSS obtained the approval to conduct a degree in Logistics and Transport in 2013. However, there was no proper term in sinhala at that time. Accordingly, the Gazette notification was issued with the Sinhala term propesed by the authorities at that time. However the Industry Experts Critizised this term as it did not reflect the real meaning. Accordingly, FMSS introduced the most suitable Sinhala Term in 2021in consultation with expert in logistics representing academia and professionals.

In 2021 the Faculty of Management and Social Sciences published the first - ever text book for the benefit of the School children, undergraduate, teachers, university lecturers and industry professionals.

Publication of a Sinhala Textbook on Logistics - 2021

- Description: Published a comprehensive textbook in Sinhala, aligning with the G.C.E. (A.L.) syllabus and undergraduate curricula.
- Objective: To provide accessible learning materials for students pursuing logistics education.
- Outcome: Bridged the language gap in logistics education, making it more inclusive.




13. Vertically intergrating the knowledge ...





15. Academic Excellence and sustainability

FMSS periodically introduced new Degree programs following Product Life Cycle theory. FMSS initially marketed the BSc International Transportation Management and Logistics (ITML) of Dalian Maritime University in 2007. This was one year later of University of Moratuwa introducing the BSc (Hons) Transport and Logistics Degree in the Faculty of Engineering. FMSS strategically commenced the degree in the Management Faculty considering the majority of management characteristics in the new discipline instead of delivering it from the Engineering faculty. It was a success story, and the graduates were competing well in the industry and in the job market. The gap in the Sri Lankan job market was more towards logistics managers rather than transport engineers. FMSS introduced the local version of the same degree to approach another segment of the education market. The local syllabus approved by the University Grants commission was BSc (Hons) Logistics and Transport (LT). Considering the entry qualification for the degree is being open to all Advanced Level streams the third product related to same discipline namely, Supply Chain Management was introduced in 2018 as a management degree namely, BMgt (Hons) Supply Chain Management. FMSS keeps a control of the overall graduate output per year in line with available job opportunities and industry demand.



CINEC is a self funded higher education Institute. Therefore, its finances has to be managed strategically and wisely. Faculty Management carefully analyze the market conditions and implement various business plans to capture the target market in a socially responsible manner.

FMSS has shown a steady growth since its inception both in academic expansion and financial gain. Handling marketing activition in an education institute is challenging especially at undergraduate level. The course fees are paid by parents and students consume the services of Institute. So the institute should strategically manage a customer and a consumer for each case.

First UGC degree was in the Gazette of Sri Lanka in 2013 which is a significant milestone in vertically integrating Logistics education in Sri Lanka.






Due to the relevance of research publication skills to students a strategic approach was initiated by the Dean of the faculty chair Professor Lalith Edirisinghe to engage them in this task.

38. Initiatives to Expand the Seafaring Community in Sri Lanka

Under the new education Concept Introduced by the Faculty of Management and Social Sciences namely, Education Vertical Intergration, the second key project in vertically intergrating Maritime education was launched.

Sri Lanka, with a sea area seven times its land area, is uniquely positioned to become a leading hub for seafaring professionals. However, despite the high demand for Sri Lankan seafarers due to their excellent track record, the nation faced a critical challenge in bridging the awareness gap about lucrative maritime career opportunities. This report outlines a series of strategic initiatives undertaken between 2021 and 2024 to increase the seafaring community from 16,500 in 2022 to 50,000 by 2030. The goal is to achieve a projected annual foreign exchange income of USD 1.5 billion while fostering maritime education and awareness at the grassroots level.

Authoring a Foundational Textbook - 2021

- Activity: Developed a textbook designed to serve as the base document for creating a school curriculum from Grade 6.
- Objective: To introduce maritime concepts early in the education system, inspiring interest in the maritime industry among young students.
- Outcome: The textbook laid the groundwork for a comprehensive educational framework, aligned with national interest.

The same approach as in the Logistics textbook was applied in this book too to attract young students to read the book. All artistic drawings were done by a schoolgirl because the new subject will be taught from grade six in schools.






43. Establishing National Recognition and Educational Infrastructure to suit future demands

- Outcome: Enhanced the capacity of educators to design an effective maritime curriculum.






